During the 1850's the reputed first graduate of Episcopal High School, the Reverend George Smith, operated "The Fairfax School" from the property. Two notable attendees were George Washington Custis Lee (Robert	
E. Lee's son) and George M. Dallas (the eleventh Vice President of the United States). During the Civil War, Union troops constructed a fort and Clarens served as its hospital. After the war, James Murray Mason, grandson of George Mason and former United States Senator from Virginia, retired to Clarens. During Mason's residence at the estate he was visited by Confederate President Jefferson Davis and Confederate General Robert E. Lee. After Mason's death, Clarens became a school for girls before resuming its role as an elegant private home. The stately Nineteenth Century
